Preface

First and foremost, Melbourne Methodist Church is a group of Christian people. Our Church - which has been active in Melbourne for well over 200 years - is a lively, vibrant church that takes its social responsibility seriously. On Sundays we enjoy relatively modern worship styles with good bible-based preaching. We are blessed with a good junior and youth church who leave the main service to enjoy their own activities in Wesley Hall next door. The church has a broad range of age groups with an excellent mix of local families and families that have moved into the area more recently. We pride ourselves in being a truly supportive, Christian family church with an extensive pastoral support network into the community. We support many of the town's events taking an active part in the Melbourne Festival and Carnival Days.

This plan builds upon the Church Vision Document, first compiled in September 2021. The focus of the church at that time was to consider how to re-engage with the community following the pandemic. This led to the re-launch of the regular mission focused activities: Tiddlywinks, Tea Service, Splash, 9 months, and the formation of a new group, Crafteasy. Alongside of this there was a renewed desire to engage with those in the community who faced big challenges in their lives whether related to ill health, financial difficulty, or other factors.

At a general church meeting in September 2022, the church began to form a Mission Action Plan. Several questions were explored to enable creative thinking, dreaming and what the next steps might be.

The first set of questions were: Why is this church here? What is its purpose? Why do you feel called to be a part of it?

The second was simply how much do we know about the community in which we are placed?

And finally, two questions with a more creative focus:

- If the church burned down tomorrow, what would we do?
- If we received an anonymous two-million-pound bequest what would we do with it?

The conversation and feedback from this meeting provided the basis for a mission action plan, along the lines set out by the Mission Planning Toolkit produced by the Methodist Church, and the 'Leading your Church into Growth' resources.

This mission plan is a work in progress, but the church has completed some of the planning/action process as outlined above: deciding a process, carrying out a community audit, a church review and spent some time dreaming together. This update is the next step in identifying our next actions.

Current church activities:

However, whilst these conversations and explorations are ongoing, the church is not standing still. The list below, though not exhaustive, gives an indication of the church's current activity. The items in italics indicate new aspects (post pandemic) in the life of the church.

- Sunday worship to be the best it can be.
- 9 months: support for new parents. Tiddlywinks and Splash: worship, crafts, bible stories, puppets and play for pre-school children.
- Start: a course for adults exploring faith to which the parents of the above activities were invited.
- Monthly Afternoon Tea Service which includes a time of worship.
- Summer Holiday Club, Light Party and Easter Party to which Primary School age children are invited.
- Crafteasy: a morning twice a month to which all are invited.
- Advent and Lent study groups, house groups and bible study.
- Junior Church and Young People's group (currently engaging with Youth Alpha)
- Family picnics and camping weekend.
- Monthly Coffee Mornings
- Financial support for charities (10% of giving) including: Care for the Family, Street Pastors (currently 4 members are active in this role), the Phakamisa project and Compassion.
- Working with Melbourne Junior and Infant schools to support families in financial need offering Sainsbury's vouchers and a 'warm space' with food and fun after school.
- Involved with Melbourne Carnival as stewards for the parade.
- A venue for the Melbourne Arts Festival.
- Share and prayer: a twice monthly prayer meeting on a Sunday evening.
- Themed preaching.
- Engaging with Melbourne Churches Together at key times e.g., Remembrance, switching on of Christmas lights, Christian Aid Week, Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.
